The First Biennial Comprehensive Survey of Neuroradiologists' Current Work Effort and Environment

This is a survey from James Y. Chen and Frank J. Lexa. The goal of the survey is to assess all practice environments of currently practicing neuroradiologists throughout United States. Our goal is to identify trends, attitudes, and effects of changes in the neuroradiology work environment and to publish these results so that practitioners and practice leaders can have better data to improve the management of the neuroradiology practice environment. We plan to repeat the survey every other year. We estimate that the survey may take up to 10-15 minutes.
